Meeting Minutes

The regular monthly meeting of the San Angelo Amateur Radio Club, Inc., was called to order by President Glenn Miller/ AA5PK on March 9 at 1930.

Introductions were made with 18 members and 2 guests in attendance.

The minutes for the February meeting were approved as printed in the March issue of *The Kilo-What*, and Treasurer's Report was approved as read.

Old Business

April 15 has been tentatively set for the clubhouse cleanup. We will meet at 0900 at the clubhouse and lunch will be provided (grilled hamburgers, etc..)

Don/N5SVK briefed the results of the Terlingua bike races which he attended February 18. He said there were approximately 400-450 participants and a good time was had by all. The meal at the Rock House was super!

Stan Meador briefed on the upcoming X Bar Shoot Out bike races and asked for our participation on May 21. He said they have moved the race from September to May in order to increase participation. There will be 25-, 50-, and 75-kilometer courses and racing should begin and finish early on Sunday. There will be six (6) checkpoints in addition to the start/finish where need to support with communications gear. Stan said he would like to recognize our contributions (past and present) and asked for suggestions as to how they might show their appreciation. He mentioned allowing use of their facilities for a private SAARC get together as an option. A show of hands was requested to gauge participation from club members in the X Bar Shoot Out. The new Technician class test pool will be effective in July of this year.

President's Message

We've gotten a lot accomplished since the last club meeting:

We've arranged for the Technician license class to be held in the San Angelo Health Foundation's meeting rooms (River View Rooms I and II) at the San Angelo Visitor's Center (after registering with them as an eligible organization) and the class dates were confirmed for May 6 and 13. The classes will run from 0900 until 1600. The meeting room is very nice with a projection screen, seating for 30+, and will be a great place to present our class. And, probably best of all, use of the room is at no cost. We'll have access to the room all day on both Saturdays. Get the word out to anyone interesting in getting their ticket. I've put the finishing touches on the PowerPoint presentations we'll be using to present the license class and I've passed them on to Ralph/KA5ULE, the co-instructor for the class. As much as I'd like to take credit for the nice PowerPoint slides, we owe a big thanks to Alan Sewell/N5NA from Midland ARC who did all the real work. I've assembled a few PPT presentations myself, and I can attest to the time involved in making a class presentation such as the one he had done and offered to anyone who wants to modify and use. I'll give a preview at the April club meeting after the PSK demonstration. At this writing, we have eight students signed up for the class.

Along the line of the PSK demo, on March 26, John/KC5FMX, Gary/N5GRC and I raised the trap dipole that Paul/N7SDQ donated to the club into an inverted vee hanging off the tower. Other than finding it difficult to locate good places to tie off the ends, the installation went pretty well in spite of the 40 mph wind gusts. An SWR check shows it works great on both 40 and 75 meters, and it will be used for the PSK demonstration in April. We may have to come up with a more permanent location to tie off the ends of the antenna.

Having agreed to participate in Awareness Day event at Sunset Mall on April 22, I ordered some ARRL material to provide as give-aways at our display table. In addition to the display kit offered by the ARRL, I also procured 100 very nice, color "Hello..." flyers. "Hello..." is the ARRL's latest public relation campaign commemorating 100 years of voice radio broadcasting. 

DXpeditions in April: According to the AR-Cluster Network for the week of March 19-26, there were 222 countries active. DX in April: J6/WB5ZAM, FS, 9Q, JD1, TK, **VU4 on the 18th**, YVØ-Aves, PYØ-Fernando de Naronha, FM, 8P, V31, TK, and J7.

Island of the Month

FR/T- Tromelin: Located east of Mozambique in the Indian Ocean, with the highest ground just 40

feet above sea level, it lies at 15°52'S/54°25'E. Rising so little above the tides, the island is a nature preserve as well as a remote weather station for the French Indian Ocean weather services. There is a central, sand-covered runway used by the French to repair their equipment, for scientists working with the turtles and sea birds, and the rare amateur DXpedition. This is your classic surf, sand, sea birds and sea turtle island with lowgrowing vegetation, a constant wind, and little rain. The waters beyond the reef drop sharply to 4000 feet in depth, so not much comes to the islands, except wayward sailors and the occasional

lost boat. The island is pear-shaped by the photos from the 1998 DXpedition, and the weather is tolerable (except during cyclones.)

Lying 220 miles from Mozambique, getting to the island is extremely difficult. Claimed by France and Madagascar, it is not exactly your tourist island. But, if you were careful navigating the reef and were wandering in the area and got past the pirates in the Mozambique Channel, you would find an island that has been passed by time. There are rumors of the ghosts of slaves from shipwrecked slave ships that died waiting for rescue, haunting the island. And the absolute silence and the 73– to 83-degree temperatures every day would become tedious, one would think.
