---Digital Mode Activities and Progress within the West Texas Section---

At my request, Howard Collier, WB5EKW, West Texas Section Emergency Coordinator, and Lance Tolar, KD5EFB, both from Abilene, prepared comments concerning Digital Mode Operations in West Texas. Howardøs comments are as follows:

To improve and expand our digital communications throughout the West Texas Section, we now have a full time WinLink 2000 system in Abilene, callsign of KF5JJK, hosted by Lance Tolar, KD5EFB. WinLink is for sending e-mail via RF. It includes both a VHF 145.010 Mhz port and now we have added a full time HF Pactor station using a dedicated Kenwood TS-480/SAT transceiver with a computer and the PTC-IIpro Modem for Pactor 1, 2 and 3 modes. The Pactor system scans several assigned frequencies on 80, 40 and 30 Meters looking for connect requests for ARES Digital Communications. Currently there are two Winlink vhf/uhf stations in El Paso, hosted by AE5HE and KB5HPT (each with VHF and UHF Winlink and one VHF Winlink station in Lubbock, hosted by KS5Z. And to add to this Winlink system, we now have two new VHF Packet stations on the air, one in Bangs, Texas, hosted by Clint Wynne, N5TBS and in Santa Anna, hosted by John Pearce (KE5NYB). Winlink systems are needed throughout all of West Texas. Will you take up the challenge and setup a like system in your hometown? If you are interested in joining with digital communications systems, please contact:

Island of the Month-FO- French Polynesia-Moorea Island: Twelve miles from Tahiti is the õmagical islandö called Moorea. With 50 square miles of mountainous island, gorgeous beaches, World War Relics, active volcanoes, the island calls to world travelers. Located at 17d31øS and 149d50øW, part of the Society Island chain, the island is part of the French Polynesian Protectorate. The

largest city is Paopao-Maharepa, with 4,244 inhabitants (one of which is FO4BM ó a very active ham, who likes 10-15 meters). Total island population in 2007 was 16,191. The highest peak is Mount Tohivea at 3000 feet. The island is surrounded with reefs, and deep water, making water based adventure possible, and hiking, biking, in the hills and jungles, an exciting



alternate to lying on the beach. They have two 18 hole golf courses, one a Jack Nicklaus design. (Club õBali Haiö is on the north coast- wasnøt that in an Elvis movie?). Nearly all vacation spots would be a challenge for antenna directivity (but who can play radio in Paradise?). The islands were settled by South Asians over 1000 years ago. Our friends Captain Cook and Charles Darwin both visited and hastened civilizing the islands. Although the island is only twelve miles from Tahiti, regular transportation between the islands was non-existent until in the 1860øs. An airport was completed in 1967. One of the local photos on Google Earth is of a WWII bomber that crashed high on one of the mountains. Go to the links below and read all the info available on the island. I do know of one local San Angeloan that goes there on a regular basis to scuba

dive, and swears it is the best in the world. The weather there is of course tropical, either the wet season or the dry season. Average rainfall is 36 inches a year. November thru to April is the wet season, and they have a very high humidity to go with the heat, making it a not so agreeable time to visit. And there is a chance that õForrest Gumpøsö family was there not long ago. Who knows, but there is a plantation called Gump Station, at the entrance to Cookøs Bay. It is actually a research facility from the University of California, Berkley. They describe the island õSurrounded by a well-developed coral reef and lagoon system (12 reef passes), Moorea (132 sq Km) is a high (1207m), 1.2 million year old volcanic island with freshwater streams that flow year-round. A range of terrestrial, freshwater, and marine habitats are located close to the station. Interdisciplinary studies are especially welcome. The six volumes



of the Proceedings of the Fifth International Coral Reef Congress (1985), held on Tahiti, contain detailed information about the biology and geology of Moorea and other French Polynesian islands.ö National Geographic.com has published a <u>collec-</u> tion of articles on work carried out by Moorea Biocode and other scientific teams



based at the Gump and CRIOBE research stations. Commander Keith Alan Roberts

SAN ANGELO - Commander Keith Alan Roberts, beloved husband, father, brother and friend passed from this life far too early after a lengthy battle with cancer on Monday, Nov. 21, 2011. Keith was born in Los Angeles on Oct. 22, 1946, to Dr. Clyde and Betty Roberts. They moved to San Angelo in 1949. Keith attended Santa Rita Elementary, Lee Junior High and graduated from San Angelo Central High in 1965. He was a first chair trumpet player in the Central band and played the electric organ in a local band called The Mystics. Keith attended Angelo State University for one year before volunteering to enlist in the <u>United States Navy</u> where he proudly served for 27 years. He was a 1974 graduate of the <u>University of Texas</u> with a bachelor of arts in mathematics, a 1986 graduate of the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterrey, Calif., with a masters in communication and he received a bachelor of business administration from Angelo State University in 1998. While in the Navy, Keith served on the submarine USS Menhaden RM2 from 1968-

1971, where he was the leading radio man on the vessel. He also served on the Kiska, the USS John A. Moore as the ships control officer and on the Meyerkord. He was executive officer of Surface Warfare School Pacific in Coronado, Calif., from 1988-1991 and chief of staff for the U.S. Naval Forces Alaska in Juneau, Alaska, from 1991-1994. Keith Roberts received numerous awards during his service, including the Meritorious Service Medal, two Navy commendation medals, Navy Expeditionary Medal, two National Defense Medals, Navy Enlisted Good Conduct Award, Vietnam Service Medal and Expert Pistol Medal. He also received a Certificate of Appreciation for Service in Armed Forces from President Bill Clinton. Commander Roberts was an avid Ham radio operator. He was a member of the San Angelo Amateur Ham Radio Club of San Angelo and Emergency Monday Check In. Keith logged thousands of hours talking with friends around the world using his call name K5LSM. He was well-known for his brilliant mind and his quick wit and sarcasm. He was a true countryman and patriot and believed strongly in standing up for the country that he loved and fought for. A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Tueday, Nov. 29, at First United Methodist Church. There will be a private three volley salute to Commander Roberts at Goodfellow Air Force Base at a later date and he will receive a burial at sea with full military honors. Keith is survived by his wife, Carol Roberts and her children, Courtney and Trevor Butts; daughter Tammy Endicott and her husband, Greg, of Spokane, Wash.; daughter Deanna Vick and her fiance, Dean Kemmer, of Rathdrum, Idaho; daughter Tricia Marcel and her husband Jesse of Liberty Lake, Washington; eight grandchildren, Gabi Endicott, Graydon Endicott, Matthew Endicott and Mitchell Endicott, Gannon Vick and Chelsea Vick, Anthony Marcel and Audrey Marcel; his sister, Ann Stringer and her husband, Frank Stringer; and his sister, Patsy Cleere and her husband, Kirk Cleere. Keith was a special uncle to Ali Keating and her husband, Thad Keating, of Denver and their children, Max and Fischer, Jamie and Amanda Stringer of Denver, Dixon Cleere of College Station and Jewel and Jabyn Cleere of San Angelo. He will be greatly missed by his family and many friends including Joe and Judy Christian, Alex and Sylvia Papoutsas, Jim and Kathy Barrow and Bob Taylor. Carol would like to extend her sincere appreciation to the head/neck and reconstruction team at MD Anderson Cancer Center. The family requests that memorials be made to Show of Support Hunt for Heroes; San Angelo Hamm Radio Club; or the American Cancer Society for the establishment of a skilled nursing facility to assist throat cancer patients needing a dobhoff feeding tube.
