Schertz Hamfest

A Long Way To Schertz And A Longer Way Back

As I may have mentioned, Cathyos (my wife) Dad joined Company 889 of the Civilian Conservation Corp at the age of 19 in 1933. He started working on the Caddo Lake project and moved on with Company 889 to other projects around the state. Many of the CCC building projects are now managed by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). My wife became interested in the CCC work and as a result we are revisiting a number of Parks to more closely study the work the of CCC. When I plan to go to a hamfest we also try to visit the Parks in that area and take care of any other business we may have in the area as well.

The trip to Schertz was no exception. Heading south from Eden, our first stop was Leaky to visit an antique shop where we have done business before. Down the street we stopped for coffee, a turnover and bought a BBQ sandwich to eat by the Frio River in Garner State Park under the bare Cypress trees. After taking some pictures it was off to San Antonio, where we had to stop at the SAS (San Antonio Shoe) store and factory at Zarzamora and the Laredo Highway. (This is must visit any time we are near San Antonio.) While the wife shopped, I visited the antique cars displayed in the building and outside. Just inside the front door is a huge 1933 Studebaker four door sedan with huge headlamps, huge whitewall tires and a hood stretching halfway to tomorrow. As my first car was a 1936 Dodge four door, I always enjoy visiting the Studebaker. Outside the antiques include a Rambler sedan (I had a Rambler station wagon) and a 1965 Mustang sedan (I had a convertible). After sufficient reminiscing, I topped off this visit with a small dish of Butter-Pecan ice cream in the ice cream shop in the SAS store.





From there it was up I-10 to the Oreck dealer for some bags and across to Schertz on 1604. Checking into the Best Western on I-35, we walked next door to the KFC for a light supper.

After a hot breakfast at 6:00 AM it was down the Schertz Parkway to the Schertz Civic Center. Tickets were on sale a little after 7:00 and we were allowed in about 7:45 as the vendors were mostly set up by then. There were many familiar faces in the crowd and manning the tables. I left \$17.00 for a 200 μA meter and some clip-on cable chokes. There was lots of other stuff with most all tables sold out. Another feature of the hamfest was the hot food available in the center snack area.

There were continuous talks presented in the Center conference room, all of possible interest to Hams. It was a bit cold for tailgaters but a few braved it. All in all, this was a good Hamfest.

Leaving the Hamfest and collecting Cathy and baggage, it was on to Palmetto, Lockhart and Bastrop State Parks and then on to Goliad for the night. After checking in we drove around town for a while and settled on the Hanging Tree Restaurant for dinner on the courthouse square. A trophy hunter has loaned the restaurant many heads which occupy the longest wall. The last is a Caribou. After examining these, we went to checkout. I told the cashier I thought the Caribou was not that at all, but a horseøs head the taxidermist had changed a bit and added some deformed antlers so as to have some fun. I said this with a serious tone and face. He laughed and reaffirmed it was indeed a Caribou but I am sure there was just a little doubt in his sparkling eyes!





After stopping at Goliad State Park, we went to Goose Island. We missed seeing the cranes but did visit the 1000 year old Oak the CCC had put a fence around to protect it in the 1930s. From there it was a stop in Corpus Christi with a fifth story room with a view of the bay and marina. A late seafood lunch at Landryøs still gave us time to tour Corpus. The next morning, we had a hot breakfast on the 11th floor of the motel with a great view of the marina and bay. As, in another life, my wife and I thought we wanted to retire to blue-water sailing, we always enjoy watching the sailboats come and go from the marina.

The next day we toured Lake Corpus Christi State Park where the CCC made the blocks for the pavilion from local caliche and cement.

I have the following free items for anyone interested:

- 1: diplexer set for 1090 MHz with 5 pole tuned cavity filter on transmit and 7 pole tuned cavity on receive. Tunable, should tune to 1200 MHz or 900 MHz with a screwdriver;
- 2: signal monitor probe 2 ports 30 db attenuation, about 6 n connectors appear to be silver plated for 1080 MHz;
- 3: 2 meter Yagi 100 feet long on two pieces of 200 pound nylon line. about 44 elements and 19 db gain. This antenna is really ugly but it works. I made it out of aluminum ground wire so the elements are flexible and sort of droop a lot.
